New Disposal Site Hours—Again

August 1, 2006 will bring with it changes to our disposal site hours—yet again. In order to be compliant with our Certificates of Approval (authorization from the Ministry of the Environment to have a disposal site) and avoid fines starting at \$25,000 per occurrence, we have had to recall all keys that ratepayers may hold to our disposal sites. Subsequently, to provide an alternative to the holding of disposal site keys, to provide access to our ratepayers, and to reduce the number of human/bear encounters at our campgrounds we have had to make some amendments



to our current schedule. After considering various options Council has decided to operate the following schedule **as a trial**. We will now be opening our sites at Kenny Road and Bissett Creek Road daily, for a total of one hour **each evening**

during the summer/fall months.

Beginning August 1, 2006 the disposal site on the Bissett Road will be open from 6:00 p.m.—7:00 p.m. The site on Kenny Road will be open from 7:30 p.m.—8:30 p.m. We believe that these

changes will provide the most effective access for **all** ratepayers. It is our plan to modify our schedule for winter months as there will be reduced demand. We will keep you posted.

Please be advised that there will no longer be access to the sites during the daytime. We reiterate that this is a trial period. We will monitor use and make amendments to this schedule as is necessary.

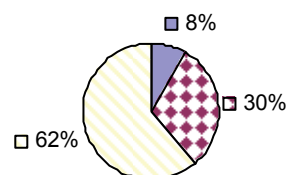

Final 2006 tax bills have been mailed. Due dates for 2006 installments are July 31st and October 31st.

Did you know that only 8% of your taxes stay with the municipality? 30% goes to the provincial government for education and 62% goes to the County. For 2006 \$152,000 is all we will keep.

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ARE YOU PLANNING TO BUILD?

Building Information is Now Available at the Township Office

One of the challenges with doing something new is not having all the information you need before you get started. And besides, the rules keep changing. Are you planning to build? Renovate? Redecorate? Don't know whether or not you need a permit? Well we have the information you need. We have developed and produced a number of handouts that tell you exactly what you need to know **before** you start to build.



"When is a Building Permit Required?" lets you know which projects do and which do not require a permit. It explains how to prepare and submit your application for permit, what the approval process involves and what the required notices and inspections are.

"A Homeowner's Guide to Building Permits" explains how to apply for a permit, a detailed list of which types of plans are required, occupancy permits and notices and inspections.

"A Homeowner's Guide to Porches & Decks" is just that. It explains when a permit is required, lists the plans

required and specifics for different types of decks.

"A Homeowner's Guide to Sewage Systems" classifies various systems, discusses qualifications of installers and lists requirements for the application of your permit and location of your system.

Deux Rivieres "Protestant" Cemetery

Due to circumstances beyond our control, the Townships are currently undergoing a process by which we will obtain ownership of the "abandoned" cemetery in Deux Rivieres, behind the Sarrazin Inn, known locally as the "Protestant" Cemetery. This cemetery is actually on private land and was never officially owned by any Church. Due to financial constraints imposed by the Province, the costs of maintaining this cemetery as an

"active" cemetery are prohibitive. As a result, the landowners are in effect "abandoning" it and we are unable to operate it. As a condition of the transfer of this cemetery to the Townships the Judgment details that we must "resolve and determine that there shall be no further interments under any circumstances in or within any part of the aforementioned cemetery property." Further, no new marker, monument, tombstone, plaque,

headstone or other structure may be erected within or on the lands. The Townships will be responsible for the upkeep of the property and will keep a public register at the Township Office recording the name of each person interred at the cemetery, the location of interment and the date. Please be advised that this transfer is imminent and that the Townships will be responsible for ensuring that no future interments will take place.

Veteran's Memorial Project

As you may have read in a recent edition of the NRT, a group of involved residents have organized to work towards erecting a memorial to honour those who have served our country, in times of war and in peace time. A plaque with the names of all known individuals, will be affixed to a large rock that will be located beside the Township Office in Stonecliffe in memoriam. Plans include a small gar-

den and walkway, a visitor's log and the monument itself. This project has been taken on by a group of residents who have been working diligently to organize and obtain funding for the memorial. Council has promised a contribution and funds have been received from various businesses in the area. However, further donations would be appreciated and will be accepted at the Township office to

make this project all it can be. Do you know someone who's life and memory you would like to honour? Would you consider a donation to this worthy cause? If so, please forward cheques made payable to the Townships with "Memorial Fund" in the memo section. A tax receipt will be issued. Thank you to those who have already generously contributed time and money to this notable project.

Township Emergency Response Plan

What is your part?

In Ontario the *Emergency Management and Civil Protection Act* governs responsibility for emergency response. Under this act "every municipality shall develop and implement an emergency management program and the council of the municipality shall by by-law adopt the emergency management program". The Township currently has an Emergency Response Plan that details how we will organize to handle emergencies. This document is available for viewing at the Township Office and on-line. It is available for your information, please, take the time to familiarize yourself with it.

Further under the Emergency Management Doctrine for Ontario it states that "Individuals are responsible for the safety, preparedness, and well being of themselves and their family. At a minimum, everyone should possess an awareness of the hazards that might affect him or her and be sufficiently prepared to deal with them. This should include being prepared to take care of themselves and their families **for up to three days** in the event of an emergency." Are you prepared? Do you have your emergency kit assembled?

The Townships Community Emergency Management Program Committee is always looking for interested individuals to help prepare our community for emergencies. Is this something that might interest you? Please call for more information.

Off-Road Vehicles and Township Roads

It's that time of year, everyone wants to get out and enjoy the outdoors, each in their own way. We have had a number of instances involving off-road vehicles and questions about access to Township roads.

The MTO website at <http://www.mto.gov.on.ca/english/dandv/orv.htm> is a wealth of information. However, for a brief summary...

Off-road vehicles (ORVs) now have more access to the shoulder and paved portions of **some** Ontario highways. These new regulations, effective July 31, 2003, apply exclusively to one category of ORV. This is defined as an off-road vehicle that:

- has four wheels, the tires of which are all in contact with the

ground;

- has steering handlebars;
 - has a seat that is designed to be straddled by the driver; and
- meets requirements of federal [Motor Vehicle Safety Act](#) and American National Standards Institute.

(New regulations do not apply to other types of off-road vehicles such as mini-bikes, dirt bikes and moto-cross bikes.)

Where Off-Road Vehicles Can / Cannot Travel

- New regulations apply to provincial highways only
- Prohibited from 400 series highways, Trans-Canada Highway (17)

As of July 2003, municipalities were given the authority to determine whether or not off-road vehicles (ORVs) should be allowed access to highways *under their authority*. If a by-law does not exist, ORVs are not allowed access to that municipality's road.

The Township does not have such a by-law therefore ORVs are not allowed access to highways (roads) under our authority. Since we do not have a by-law we subsequently do not have any authority to enforce ORV issues. This is a *Highway Traffic Act* issue, and as such, should you have any concerns—please call the OPP.
