Disposal Sites will be closed **Thursday, December 26**. Mackey and Stonecliffe



Collection will occur on **Friday, December 27**. The site will not be open until Saturday.

Recycling Collection will occur as usual on **December 30** and **January 6**.

The Garbage Collection on **December 27 & 31** and **January 2 & 7** will be Amnesty Days where more than the usual one bag of

garbage will be collected roadside. For these dates, two untagged bags of normal household garbage will be allowed. Rules as to unacceptable materials and sorting of recyclables will be enforced. We are simply allowing an additional bag due to the "normal" amount of extra waste accumulated during the holidays.

HCM Library - Community News Winter 2013

It seems the older we get the more amazed we are at how fast time flies, but here we are getting ready to celebrate the Christmas Holidays. During the holiday season our library will be closed all stat holidays as outlined in the Township portion of the newsletter but we will be open Saturday Dec. 28 volunteer present. If a volunteer should not be available the closure will be posted on the library door.

As for what is happening in the library we are revving up the **History Project** by training a volunteer to scan, upload and access the information entrusted to us for the site <http://images.ourontario.ca/hcml/search> . That means should you have photos or historical documents that you would like placed on the site you can bring them to the library, have them scanned and processed. The library would like to share with its patrons the fact that **late fees** have become a concern. We have forgiven fees in the past but would like everyone to know that we are working on a “onto time return” policy so late fees will now be enforced. The library is manned 3 times a week and we have a drop off slot in the Township Hall Door for your convenience. Because of how the library is manned everyone gets a few extra days grace when they drop of the books to the library but long over- dues will be notified. N O S N O W O N M U N I C I P A L R O A D S

Annual snowplow operations begin with the first significant snowfall of the year. This can be as early as November 15 (our contract start date) or as late as Mother Nature decides. Township bylaws and the *Highway Traffic Act* prohibit parking or stopping on a road

in a way that interferes with plowing operations. Plow operators need clear roadways to complete their routes safely and on time. Under the *Highway Traffic Act*, residents are prohibited from depositing snow on any roadway. When clearing snow, pile it on your

property - do not shovel it onto the road or across the road into the ditch. This practice is dangerous because it may cover the salt/sand applied and may cause drivers to lose control. It may also cause windrows of snow that freeze across the road causing further hazards.

At its meeting of Friday, September 27, 2013 the Council of the United Townships of Head, Clara & Maria, after public consultation, passed a resolution to alter disposal site hours for the months of January, February and March of 2014 in the

same manner as in 2013. Both sites will remain open on Saturday but the hours on Tuesday and Thursday will be reduced somewhat. On Tuesday, the Bissett Creek Road site will be open from 12:30–2:00 instead of 3:30 and on

Thursday, the Kenny Road site will be open from 12:45–2:30 instead of 4:15. Saturday hours remain as usual – Bissett Creek Road –12:45–3:45 and Kenny Road–8:30–12:00 noon.
