A MESSAGE FROM MAYOR GIBSON

Hello all,

Well old man winter is doing his best to hang around as there is still a fair bit of snow in the bush. Anyone who harvested maple syrup this year had a bountiful time. This spring was one of the very best production years in a long time.

In the last newsletter I promised to let you know the results of my attempts to change some of the governance rules at County Council. Unfortunately my pleas for more transparent governance fell on deaf ears so there are no progressive changes to the County's procedural bylaw. I am certainly getting used to being the lone dissenting vote on many County issues.

I brought in a member's motion that all items with respect to County Council governance be dealt with by full County Council and not by committee. The reason for this is so our governance documents, especially our Procedural Bylaw and our new Code of Conduct, would be debated by the 17 members of County Council and not eight members of a committee. I also suggested the weighted vote bylaw not apply to governance issues. The most important part of any Municipality's operation is their governance documents and in my humble opinion they are just too important to be handled at the committee level. The Finance and Administration Committee, who currently deal with governance issues, is comprised of eight members who collectively carry 104 of the total 194 weighted votes. So you see my concern. Here we have an eight member committee who can basically run County Council with respect to issues under their responsibility. The Warden appoints the Striking Committee who then recommends to County Council the chairs and other committee members. The Warden is a voting member of all main committees. I felt this is just too much power and influence in the hands of one person and one committee to be considered fully democratic.

We had good company recently when Brudenell Lyndock and Raglan just recently decided to change the name of their Head of Council from Reeve to Mayor. There are no municipalities left in the County that call their Head of Council Reeve. Five of the larger municipalities have both a Mayor and a Reeve and send their Reeves to County Council to represent them. Deep River bounces back and forth on the issue and currently Glen Doncaster serves as Deep River's Reeve.

The County is getting ever closer to reaching an agreement to purchase the abandoned CP rail line in conjunction with Lanark County and the Townships of Papineau Cameron. All specific details of the deal are held in closed session of both the Property and Development Committee and County Council so I am restricted in what I can tell you. You didn't know I could keep a secret, did you?

It is important to consider that HCM Rec Committee holds its own permanent liquor license for the community centre, and are held responsible for the safe service and consumption of alcohol. One particular license requirement specifies that patrons are not allowed to consume alcohol on Township property unless it is in a designated, licensed area that has been approved by the Alcohol Gaming Commission of Ontario. We have applied and been approved for a temporary outdoor extension off of the hall to allow people to enjoy a beverage and watch the games without violating the license regulations. Consuming alcohol is only permitted inside the community center and the fenced extension located outside of the building. Please do not drink and drive. There will be designated drivers available for those who live in HCM.

In recent news, HCM received funding through the Healthy Kids Community Challenge to purchase recreational equipment. This equipment will be stored at the Municipal Office and available to residents to borrow. The Pickle ball equipment is available for use at the hall. We will soon have the court lines put on the helipad for outdoor use. The basketball net is also available to use on the helipad, and basketballs are located in the Municipal Office.

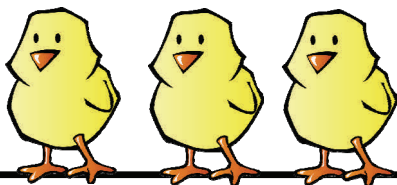

WASTE MANAGEMENT

Council and Staff have recently reviewed HCM's Waste Management operations and alternative options and have decided to make some significant changes in order to improve our costs, operations and overall landfill lifespan. We are currently working through the details and will provide more information when it is available. These changes will not affect the current level of service that our residents are receiving and we are confident that these changes will be an improvement. Beginning **June 1st, 2016**, bulky material will be accepted at Bissett Creek disposal site only. This includes mattresses, couches, chairs, furniture etc.

Drain-All will be coming to collect Household Hazardous Waste at the Stonecliffe Disposal Site June 4th from 10:00 am until 1:00 pm. See below for a list of accepted materials.

"One man's trash is another man's treasure". There are reuse sections at each disposal site for goods that you may not want anymore, but could be of value to someone else. These unwanted, **reusable** items can be brought to either site, free of charge and kept out of our landfills!

Bag Tags will be ready for pick up at the Municipal Office as of May 1st, 2016. Those that are not picked up by June 6th will be mailed. Help save costs and pick up your tags or email/call us to hold them for you. We have made arrangements to have them available at upcoming events in the community centre: Mother's Day Breakfast—May 8th ; Ball Tournament—May 14th and June Jazaar— June 4th.



Our residents are doing a good job with recycling and reducing the amount of waste that is going into our landfills. For those who need clarification or a reminder, HCM implements dual stream recycling—fibres (paper and cardboard) which are to be separated from comingled (plastic, glass, cans etc.)



Residential Two-Stream Recycling Program



Fibre Recycling Box

- Household newspaper, magazines, catalogues, flyers and junk mail
- Boxboard/paperboard: cereal boxes (no wax bags inside), cracker boxes, tissue boxes, "paper" egg cartons (no eggshells), toilet paper/paper towel rolls
- Office paper: example writing, typing and computer paper
- Cardboard (corrugated) brown "craft" paper bags, paper pet food bags(coated liner is OK)
- Soft cover books, hard cover books with spine and cover removed only
- Shredded paper must be in a clear plastic bag only
- Cardboard must be broken down into 2' x 2' bundled and tied



Commingled Recycling Box

- Tin cans (place lid inside and pinch can so lid stays in), open and empty paint cans(no plastic with metal tops and/or bottoms or handles)
- Aluminum cans, pie plates, trays and foil wrap(no foil with paper or plastic laminate), paint cans
- Clear and coloured glass food and beverage bottles and jars scraped and rinsed clean(no ceramics, no tempered glass, no mirrors)
- Plastic food and beverage containers:#1 PET bottles, #2 - #7 bottles, tubs and lids
- Milk and Juice cartons, ice cream containers rinsed and clean
- Grocery bags, outer wrap from cases of water, toilet paper and paper towels (put all of these in one bag, a bag of bags)
