Please note: The second portion of your 2017 Final Tax Bill is due on or before October 31st.

Payments Options:

- **At the office**

by cash, cheque, money order, credit card (convenience fee of 2.65%) or **NEW**—Interac tap;

*We are able to process debit card payments under \$100 if your card has the TAP option. There is **NO** cost to you for utilizing this service. Unfortunately, we cannot accept debit cards without the tap option. If that is your case, contact your bank and request to change to a debit card with Interac flash. Normally there is not cost, however, check with your bank.*

- **Outside mailbox;**

- **Online** through our website at <http://townshipsofheadclaramaria.ca/>, for which a 3.0% convenience fee will be added to the total payment amount;

- **At Scotiabank**, even as a “non-customer” if it is not your regularly used bank. Please bring a copy of your tax bill with you so they have your tax account information.

Do you have taxes owing? New Bill 68 amendments have changed, so tax sales will start after 2 years of unpaid taxes, instead of 3 years – This Bill is now in effect, however will not take effect in Head, Clara & Maria until Jan 1, 2019. This is to give additional time for property owners to pay their outstanding taxes that are two or more years overdue.

WASTE MANAGEMENT

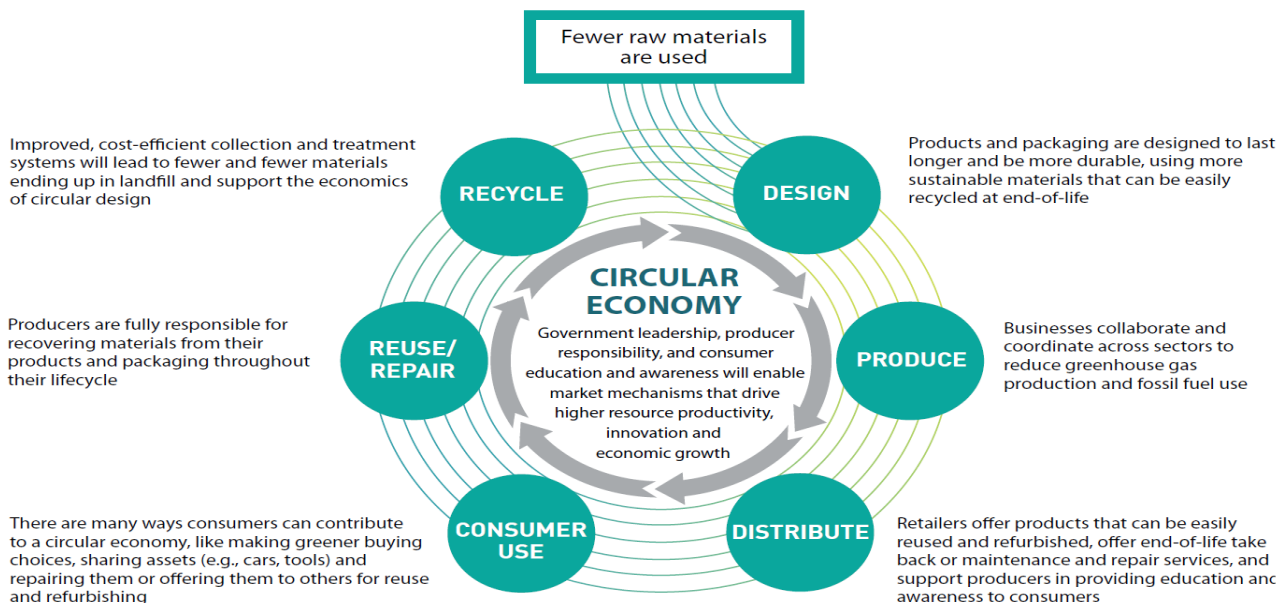
Change is coming! In November 2016, the Waste Diversion Act was repealed and replaced with the Waste-Free Ontario Act, which includes the Waste Diversion Transition Act and the Resource Recovery and Circular Economy Act. This new legislation will impact municipal waste management and waste diversion programs.

The current program cost for collecting and recycling paper products and packaging is split 50/50 between municipalities and the companies that produce these products. The new legislation will transfer full responsibility to the producer. This concept will initially be applied for paper products and packaging (e.g. glass, plastics), tires, hazardous waste and electronics. Other materials like mattresses and furniture will be considered in the future.

The new legislation has started moving full responsibility to producers, but there is still a lot of work to do. Municipalities will now have the option to act as service providers to producers who are responsible for collection and management of paper products and packaging, either directly or by subcontracting to private sector companies, OR to opt out of providing a service altogether.

The Association of Municipalities of Ontario, Municipal Waste Association, Regional Public Works Commissioners of Ontario and the City of Toronto have joined together to form the Municipal Resource Recovery and Research Collaborative ((Municipal 3Rs Collaborative) to advocate for a smooth and timely transition to full producer responsibility, and ensure that municipal priorities, like maintaining service standards, are protected. They have created a list of specific issues that must be addressed in the amended Blue Box Plan, ranging from mechanisms to be used in implementing the transition to full producer responsibility, to standards of service and program accessibility for residents.

PREVENT HEATING EQUIPMENT FIRES

WHAT'S THE RISK?

Heating equipment fires account for **1 in 10** home fires.

Heating equipment is the **second leading** cause of home fires.

In 29% of home heating fires, the cause is **lack of routine maintenance** of heating equipment.

The average dollar loss per heating equipment fire is **\$53,000**.

The leading causes of heating equipment fires are:

1. woodstoves
2. fireplace/fireplace inserts
3. chimneys.

How do I prevent a heating fire?

- ✦ Have your heating system and chimneys inspected and cleaned annually by a qualified service technician.
- ✦ Ensure all outside heating vents are not blocked.
- ✦ Ensure woodstoves, fireplaces and fireplace inserts are installed by a qualified technician according to manufacturer's instructions.
- ✦ Always use a fire screen around the fireplace.
- ✦ Allow ashes from your woodstove or fireplace to cool before emptying them into a metal container with a tight-fitting lid. Keep the container outside.



All homes with a fuel-burning appliance, fireplace or attached garage must have a working carbon monoxide alarm installed outside all sleeping areas.

Wood Heat Safety Tips

- Burn dry, well-seasoned wood to reduce risk of excessive creosote build-up.
- Store wood outdoors, stacked in an open area or shed away from the house to provide good air-flow to assist drying.
- Check chimneys and flue pipes often for creosote and soot build up and keep clean to prevent chimney fires.
- Maintain a proper cap on top of chimneys to protect against damage from rain or snow.
- Inspect spark screens on chimney caps regularly to make sure smoke can vent properly.
- Keep combustible materials a safe distance away from woodstoves and fireplaces.
- Always use a properly fitting screen for fireplaces to keep sparks and embers contained.
- Allow ashes from woodstoves or fireplaces to cool before emptying them into a metal container with a tight-fitting lid. Keep the container outside.
- Install working smoke alarms on every storey of the home and outside all sleeping areas to alert you to a fire in your home. Develop and practice a home fire escape plan with your family.
- Install a carbon monoxide alarm to alert you to the presence of deadly carbon monoxide gas.
