Reminders from the Municipal Office

Property Taxes


Interim property tax payments were due February 28th, 2023. Outstanding property tax accounts accrue interest on a monthly basis. Final property tax bills will be issued the first week of July. Payments can be made via e-transfer to payments@headclaramaria.ca, over the phone with a credit card, or in the office by cheque, debit/credit or cash. Cheques can be mailed to 15 Township Hall Road, Stonecliffe ON KOJ 2K0. Please do not send cash via regular mail. Customers of Scotiabank can also add the municipality as a payee and make their property tax payments through their financial institution.

**Please note, ensure property information (roll number and address) is submitted with your payment regardless of the method so that your payment can be applied to the proper account.*


Burn Permits

As of April 1st, a burn permit is required for anyone planning to burn brush, grass etc. on your property. This excludes small campfires. The municipality has implemented a seasonal permit system which requires the property owner to fill out an application online or in the municipal office. The cost is \$5 and is valid for the whole season; April 1– October 31. Once you have your permit, all you have to do is call or email the office when you are burning so that we can inform the Ministry of Natural Resources and Forestry; which is a component of our annual agreement. 

Building Permits

A building permit gives you legal authorization to start construction of a building project in accordance with approved drawings and specifications. Building permits are issued by the Township through its CBO and are reviewed for compliance with the Ontario Building Code, the Municipal Zoning by-law, Building by-law and other applicable provincial, county and municipal regulations. Building permits are necessary to ensure that zoning requirements, fire and structural safety standards as well as  other building standards are met. Please visit the municipal website, or contact the CBO, before beginning any new renovation projects to see if a building permit is required.

Trailer Permits

Council has recently reviewed and updated the Trailer By-Law in 2022; previously adopted in 2006. The newly updated By-Law 2021-47 provides that any person occupying a trailer on vacant land in the municipality must apply for a Trailer Permit. A seasonal fee of \$200 is payable by May 1st of each year and an application must be filled out and reviewed by municipal staff to ensure proper heating, waste disposal etc. is adequately met. Every person wishing to occupy a trailer on vacant land, and obtain a trailer license, must obtain a property identification number. Please contact the municipal office for more information.

Municipal Property Assessment Corporation

Property owners in Ontario are required to support a school board, even if they do not have children or their children are not currently attending school. In the case of a residential property occupied by tenants, the tenants can direct the school support for that property. By default, school support is directed to your municipality's English Public School Board.

The Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) is legislatively required to collect school support information and provide it in the assessment roll to every municipality and school board. By ensuring that you are supporting the school board of your choosing, you will be able to vote in the next municipal and school board election for trustees in that school board. Property owners, occupants, and tenants can update their school support designation online at mpac.ca/schoolsupport.

Direction of School Support

School Support Designation

As a property owner in Ontario, you are required to support a school board, even if you do not have children or your children are not currently attending school. By default, your school support is directed to your municipality's English Public School Board.

In the case of a residential property occupied by tenants, they can direct the school support for that property.

Property owners, occupants, and tenants can select which school board they choose to support. Additionally, you will be able to vote in the next municipal election for trustees for the school board that you choose to support.

The Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) is legislatively required to collect school support information and provide it in the assessment roll to every municipality and school board.

Changing your school support online



Based on your eligibility, property owners and tenants registered with MPAC can view and update the school support designation online.

To learn more about eligibility requirements or change your school support designation, please visit mpac.ca/schoolsupport or scan the QR code.

What if I have difficulty updating my school support online?

A step-by-step guide is available on mpac.ca which will help users navigate MPAC's school support portal. Alternatively, you can obtain the Application for Direction of School Support (ADSS) Form from mpac.ca or from your school board's office. Emergency Management

Thunderstorms

Thunderstorms can bring lightning, heavy rain, hail, strong winds and tornadoes.



Hazard information

Lightning kills about nine Canadians each year and seriously injures more than 100 people.

Safety tips

- be aware of weather conditions and warnings
- seek shelter immediately if a warning has been issued or you believe one could occur

If you are indoors:

- Stay away from windows, skylights and glass doors – strong winds and large hailstones can shatter them.
- Avoid running water in your house – lightning can enter through pipes and plumbing.
- Don't take showers or baths during a thunderstorm.
- Remain indoors during a thunderstorm and stay inside for at least 30 minutes after the last rumble of thunder.
- Be prepared to seek shelter in a basement or interior room on the lowest level if conditions worsen.

If you are outdoors:

- If you hear thunder, then lightning is close enough to be dangerous – take shelter in an enclosed building or metal-topped vehicle.
- Avoid water, high ground, isolated trees, power lines and picnic shelters – small, open structures don't protect you from lightning.
- If there's no shelter, go to a low-lying area away from tall, isolated objects – crouch down and put your feet together – do not lie down.

Prepare now

Take the following steps so you and your family are prepared in the event of an emergency:

- Have a safe room in your home where everyone gathers during a storm – away from windows, skylights and glass doors.
- If there's a tornado, gather in a basement, storm cellar or interior room on the lowest floor.
- Remove dead or rotting trees and branches that could fall and cause injury or damage.
- Bring inside or tie-down garbage cans and lawn furniture.
- Use surge protectors – a safety electrical plug that will shut off the power if lightning strikes to prevent damage to your computer and other household items.

Emergency Preparedness (EP) Week will take place from May 7 -13, 2023.
