Here is a sample of activities made possible by the New Horizons for Seniors grants. If you haven't joined us yet, we hope that you will in 2025.














EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT

COMMUNITY UPDATES AND REMINDERS

Interim property tax bills will be issued in early February with a due date of February 28th, 2025. Payments can be made via e-transfer to payments@headclaramaria.ca, over the phone with a credit card, or in the office by cheque, debit/credit or cash. Cheques can be mailed to 15 Township Hall Road, Stonecliffe ON KOJ 2KO. Please do not send cash via regular mail. Customers of Scotiabank can also add the municipality as a payee and make their property tax payments through their financial institution.

*Please note, ensure property information (roll number and address) is submitted with your payment regardless of the method so that your payment can be applied to the proper account.

Reminder: Please do not plow snow onto Municipal roads!

It is that time of year again where the Municipality is requesting cooperation of all persons in keeping vehicles from obstructing snow removal operations in the Municipality and in refraining from placing snow from private property onto Municipal roadways. WASTE MANAGEMENT

All waste within the municipality must be properly disposed of. The Collection and Land-fill Schedules are listed below. By-law 2022-12, being a by-law to regulate the collection, removal and disposal of solid waste in Head, Clara and Maria provides a list of fines associated with improper disposal of waste under "Schedule N". Please ensure waste is either set out for curbside collection, or delivered to the landfill sites, during the times listed below to keep the community clean! Recycling materials in Head, Clara and Maria are sorted according to the requirements of Ottawa Valley Waste Recovery Centre (OVWRC), as the municipality's recycling processing centre. Recycling needs to be sorted as per the guide in order to properly process the materials and reduce the amount of contamination within the materials that would, as a result, have to be landfilled. If OVWRC receives contaminated material from the municipality, they may issue fines, penalties and can even discontinue service. In order to avoid this issue, if recycling is not properly sorted, it will be refused at the curb and/or the landfill.

Did you know that there is a Re-use Centre at each of the landfill sites? "One man's trash is another man's treasure"; if you have something that you no longer need, but think someone else could benefit from its use, consider dropping it at the – reuse centre. This will help reduce the amount going into the landfill and encourage our reduce, reuse and recycle practices! It is stated in our Environmental Compliance Approval, issued by the Ministry of Environment, that no scavenging is permitted at the landfill sites with the exception of taking materials from the designated reuse centre. If there is something specific that you are looking for, please speak with the Disposal Site Attendant, he may be able to help!



The Mackey/Stonecliffe Landfill will be closed on Thursday, December 26th, 2024 due to the holiday.

Regular hours and pick-up will resume on Thursday, January 2nd, 2025.

FIRE SAFETY

The best way to stay fire safe is to prevent fires from starting. Here are some tips to help address some of the leading causes of home fires in Ontario.

Fire Safety During Power Outages

With colder weather upon us, it is important to remember these fire safety tips during a power out age. The following tips will help reduce fire risk:

- Make sure your home has battery-operated smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms. Electrically connected smoke alarms and carbon monoxide alarms will not work when the power is out unless they have battery back-ups.
- Use flashlights or battery-operated lanterns instead of candles or hurricane lamps. If using candles, place them in a secure holder and cover them with a glass chimney, away from children and pets.
- Only use propane and charcoal barbecues outdoors. Do not bring them inside.
- Purchase generators with recognized approval labels. Make sure the unit has proper connection receptacles and circuit breakers.
- Only use portable generators outdoors and ensure that exhaust fumes do not enter the home. Allow the generator to cool before refueling. Refuel the generator outside, following the manufacturer's instructions — store fuel for the generator in approved containers outside the home.
- Use only portable space heaters that have been designed for indoor use and follow the manufacturer's instructions. Provide adequate ventilation by opening a window slightly while the heater is in use. Before refueling, turn off the heater, wait for it to cool and take the heater outside to refuel.
- Make sure electric stove elements and small appliances are off or unplugged to prevent fires from occurring when the electricity is restored.
- Have at least one phone that does not require electricity to operate. Cordless phones will not work when the power is out.

Electrical Safety

Electrical equipment is a leading cause of home fires in Ontario. To prevent electrical fires:

- Avoid running cords under rugs which can damage the cord and cause a fire.
- Avoid overloading a circuit. If additional outlets or circuits are required, have them installed by a licensed electrician.
- Use extension cords only as a temporary connection, if permanent wiring is required, have additional outlets installed by a licensed electrician.
- Do not link extension cords together, use an extension cord that is long enough.
- Install ground fault circuit interrupters (GFCIs) in bathrooms, kitchens and garages (GFCIs shut off an electrical circuit when it becomes a shock hazard).
- Check electrical cords for damage, such as fraying or nicks as a damaged cord can expose wires and result in a potential shock or fire hazard.
